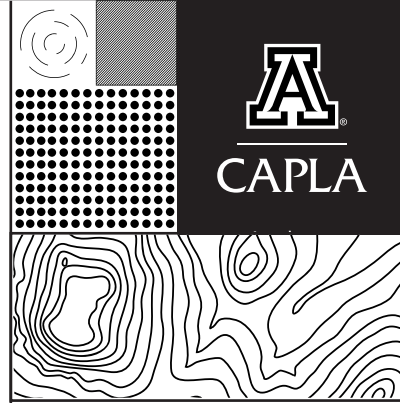


MINOR IN LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE CURRICULUM

The Minor in Landscape Architecture gives students interested in the design of the built environment the chance to engage in a course of study that includes landscape architectural history and design, landscape ecology and planning.
