Primary consultant for an invited design challenge. Major contribution, in collaboration with Kaja Kühl.

Served as competition consultants of an invited design challenge sponsored by the Long Island Index, a project of the Rauch Foundation. We selected four architect teams through a competitive process and paired them with four Long Island downtown sites with a large amount of land dedicated to surface parking and proximity to commuter rail. Designers, informed by research reports and interviews with community leaders, produced provocative, visionary concepts for next-generation parking structures, designed to help ease the transition from automobile dependency to more plural mobility frameworks.

Tasks included: concept development, organization of format and requirements, drafting and editing of REOI, design challenge brief, press releases and website texts, assembly of list of selected architects to invite, assistance in site selection, review of submissions and assistance in final selection, organization of kick-off and mid-review events, and feedback on schemes in development.

- Four teams (LTL Architects, Utile, Inc., Michael Piper of dub studios, and Roger Sherman Architecture and Urban Design) selected from dozens of responses to a highly selective Request for Expressions of Interest.
- Simultaneous kick-off events on Sept 20, 2013 in Westbury, Rockville Centre, Patchogue and Ronkonkoma, NY.
- Closed “mid-review” presentation event with all design teams, representatives from the four communities, and expert peer reviewers, Adelphi University, Garden City, NY, Oct. 11, 2013.
